

Commercial Incubator Kitchen Licensing Guide

The Kansas Department of Agriculture (KDA) is devoted to the total support of agriculture in Kansas. While we must fulfill our statutory obligations, the department is dedicated to providing support and assistance to make Kansas farms, ranches and agribusinesses successful and help them grow if that is their desire. We also encourage more farms, ranches and other agriculture businesses to expand in or relocate to Kansas. This checklist will help guide you through various resources and requirements for opening and operating a typical Kansas commercial incubator kitchen. In addition to license requirements by KDA, other Kansas agencies, as well as local or federal government agencies, may have regulatory requirements to follow. Contact your local planning authority to ensure you follow all local business development laws, rules, regulations and guidelines. This guide is designed to assist you as you work to build and operate a successful commercial incubator kitchen in Kansas.

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	U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) www.fda.gov	The commercial incubator kitchen will not need to register with the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). Each unique business that uses the facility and that distributes, manufactures, processes, packs or holds food for consumption by humans or animals may be required to register with the FDA. Detailed information about who should register can be found at the FDA website.	Biannual
	Department of Agriculture — Food Safety and Lodging www.agriculture.ks.gov	The commercial incubator kitchen is not required to have a license. Each unique business that uses the facility must have its own <u>Food Establishment License</u> or <u>Food Processing or Storage License</u> . For more information, contact the <u>Food Safety and Lodging Program</u> at (785) 564-6767 or <u>KDA.FSL@ks.gov</u> .	
	Department of Agriculture — Weights and Measures www.agriculture.ks.gov	No license is needed from Weights and Measures. Any business with a weighing or measuring device (e.g. scales, fertilizer meters, oil meters, measuring tapes, electric car chargers, taxi meters, etc.) must hire a licensed service company to inspect and test devices once annually, and any time additional maintenance, repairs, adjustments and calibrations are made throughout the year if the devices are used to determine the cost of any transaction. Examples include scales at grocery stores, yogurt shops, restaurants, hardware stores, nurseries, seed dealers, etc. Examples of meters include meters used at a car service center	Annual service
