

## Dairy Processing Facility Licensing Guide

The Kansas Department of Agriculture (KDA) is devoted to the total support of agriculture in Kansas. While we must fulfill our statutory obligations, the department is dedicated to providing support and assistance to make Kansas farms, ranches and agribusinesses successful and help them grow if that is their desire. We also encourage more farms, ranches and other agriculture businesses to expand in or relocate to Kansas. This checklist will help guide you through various resources and requirements for opening and operating a typical Kansas dairy processing facility. In addition to license requirements by KDA, other Kansas agencies, as well as local or federal government agencies, may have regulatory requirements to follow. Contact your local planning authority to ensure you follow all local business development laws, rules, regulations and guidelines. This guide is designed to assist you as you work to build and operate a successful dairy processing facility in Kansas.

	Department of Agriculture — Division of Water Resources <u>www.agriculture.ks.gov</u>	The state of Kansas requires a permit to appropriate water if used for industrial water purposes, in connection with the manufacture, production, transport, or storage of products, unless water is obtained from a rural or municipal water source. Review the <u>Kansas Water Law Basics</u> . Complete the appropriate <u>Water Appropriation Forms</u> . 	Department of Agriculture — Weights and Measures <u>www.agriculture.ks.gov</u>	No license is needed from Weights and Measures. Any business with a weighing or measuring device (e.g. scales, fertilizer meters, oil meters, measuring tapes, electric car chargers, taxi meters, etc.) must hire a <u>licensed service company</u> to inspect and test devices once annually, and any time additional maintenance, repairs, adjustments and calibrations are made throughout the year if the devices are used to determine the cost of any transaction. 		Examples include scales at grocery stores, yogurt shops, restaurants, hardware stores, nurseries, seed dealers, etc. Examples of meters include meters used at a car service center to add oil to your engine, fertilizer meters at agronomy centers, water meters in grocery stores for sale of bottled water, etc. For more information, visit the <u>Weights and Measures</u> <u>Program</u> webpage or call (785) 564-6681.	
	U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA)	Owners, operators or agents in charge of facilities that distribute, manufacture, process, pack or hold food for consumption in the United States, including dairy products, are required to register the facility with the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). 	Department of Health and Environment — Bureau of Water, Municipal Program Section	If the facility will employ an on-site wastewater treatment system for human wastewater rather than utilize a municipal sanitary sewer for handling and disposal of sewage from the facility, contact the <u>KDHE Municipal Program Section</u> at (785) 296-5527 for construction and permitting requirements. 	Department of Health and Environment — Bureau of Water, Industrial Program Section <u>www.kdheks.gov</u>	<ul> <li><u>NPDES Industrial Stormwater Permit</u> is required for the operation of the facility and must be obtained prior to the start of operation. In lieu of this permit, the operator can obtain a 'No Exposure Waiver,' found in the NPDES Industrial Stormwater Permit, if waiver requirements are met. Call (785) 296-4347 for more information.</li> <li><u>NPDES Construction Stormwater Permit</u> is required only if one or more acres are disturbed during construction. The permit is required prior to the start of soil disturbing activities</li> </ul>	Prior to construction
		(construction). For more information, contact (785) 296-5549. Any on-site water pollution control system will have to be permitted. The permit has to be issued prior to the start of construction. If wastewater will be directed to a municipal wastewater collection and treatment system for treatment and disposal, approval for use of the municipal system along with any permits need to be secured from the municipality. 	Department of Health and Environment — Bureau of Water, Public Water Supply and Geology & Well Technology Section <u>www.kdheks.gov</u>	If the facility will not utilize a municipal public water supply or rural water supply as the source of drinking water and the facility will serve 25 people or more per day, 60 or more days per year, it will be considered a public water supply subject to state/federal drinking water requirements. Contact the <u>KDHE Public Water Supply Section</u> at (785) 296-5514. Water wells shall be constructed by Kansas-licensed water well contractors. There are special construction requirements for water wells serving public water supplies. Contact the <u>KDHE</u> <u>Geology &amp; Well Technology Section</u> at (785) 296-7265 for more information.	Prior to construction
	Department of Health and Environment — Bureau of Waste Management <u>www.kdheks.gov</u>	Facilities producing specialized organic waste may compost or apply this material to the land. Composting facilities less than one-half acre must <u>register</u> with KDHE and facilities greater than one-half acre must obtain a <u>permit</u> . An <u>application for approval</u> must be obtained to apply organic waste to land. For more information, review the <u>KDHE Solid Waste</u> webpage or call (785) 296-2751.	Prior to composting or land application
	Department of Health and Environment — Bureau of Air <u>www.kdheks.gov</u>	A permit may be required if proposing to install equipment such as a fuel combustion device (e.g., boiler, engine, fuel burning unit). You must submit the Notification of Construction or Modification application form, appropriate <u>Process/Equipment forms</u> and receive a permit before commencing construction or installation of the equipment. <u>Gasoline dispensing facilities</u> are subject to federal air regulation. Refer to the <u>Standard Construction Permit/Approval for</u> <u>Gasoline Dispensing Facilities</u> if applicable.
