

Grocery & Retail Stores Licensing Guide

The Kansas Department of Agriculture (KDA) is devoted to the total support of agriculture in Kansas. While we must fulfill our statutory obligations, the department is dedicated to providing support and assistance to make Kansas farms, ranches and agribusinesses successful and help them grow if that is their desire. We also encourage more farms, ranches and other agriculture businesses to expand in or relocate to Kansas. This checklist will help guide you through various resources and requirements for opening and operating a typical Kansas grocery or retail store. In addition to license requirements by KDA, other Kansas agencies, as well as local or federal government agencies, may have regulatory requirements to follow. Contact your local planning authority to ensure you follow all local business development laws, rules, regulations and guidelines. This guide is designed to assist you as you work to build and operate a successful grocery or retail store in Kansas.

		Tobacco retailers are not licensed at this time. Tobacco distributor licenses are \$25 per calendar year.	— Yearly
		A tax is imposed upon the privilege of selling or dealing in electronic cigarettes. Each distributor of consumable material must apply for a certificate of registration. Complete form <u>EC-1</u> , <u>Application for Consumable Material Tax Registration</u> . Monthly reports must be submitted with the applicable tax payment.	
		All cigarette, tobacco and e-cigarette retailers must register to collect Kansas Retailer's Sales Tax.

	Department of Agriculture — Weights and Measures www.agriculture.ks.gov	Businesses with retail fuel meters (e.g. pumps, dispensers, delivery trucks, hydrants) must hire a service company to install, inspect, test, repair, adjust and certify the meters. 	Department of Agriculture — Pesticides and Fertilizers	Any retail business (including grocery stores, convenience stores and hardware stores) or person who sells a pesticide to another person for application must complete the Pesticide Dealer Registration and Application .	Prior to July 1

	Kansas Department of Revenue — Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) www.ksrevenue.org	Kansas law restricts the sale of alcohol in grocery stores to Cereal Malt Beverages (CMB) that are 6.0% alcohol by weight or less. CMB licenses are issued by the local governing authority, the city or county, not by the Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC). The city or county also collects the \$25 State CMB Stamp fee and affixes it to your license. Information and application forms can be found on the ABC website or you may contact ABC at (785) 296-7015.	Prior to opening
